Delphine Rudelli is a holder of two masters in public law (1993) and European labour law (1994), Delphine also studied political sciences and graduated from the Institute for Political Science of Paris in 1994.

In 1994, Delphine began her career in UIMM, the French employer's organisation for the metal and technology based industries and Ceemet member, where she advised companies in foreign labour law and European legislation. In 1999, she joined Ceemet,

the European employer's organisation for the metal, engineering and techbased industries in Brussels as a social affairs advisor.

After nearly eight years in Brussels, Delphine went at the end of 2006 back to Paris as the Head of UIMM's European affairs department where she would eventually become the Director of the European and International affairs Department.
