# Technical Seminar: Social Security as block for cross border businesses?

The revision of the Regulations on the coordination of social security systems aim at facilitating labour mobility. However, the plans that are on the table would put severe strains on labour mobility.

# What

On 13 December 2016, the European Commission published its proposal for a revision of Regulation 883/2004 on the coordination of social security systems and Regulation 987/2009 laying down the procedure for implementing Regulation 883/2004.

Ceemet has -in general- been positive about the proposal, but current discussions are going in a direction where companies are burdened with excessive unnecessary organizational requirements. This eventually limits labour mobility which is essential for Ceemet's businesses and a strong asset of the Single Market.

With this breakfast event, Ceemet focusses on the prior notification as it is the main challenge that creates extreme administrative burden and creates no added value as in the case of business trips.
